<p>Read at least 3 stories from your yellow reading journals.</p>	<p>Draw a picture of what you did on your snow day. Write at least one sentence to go with your picture.</p>	<p>Count to 100 by 10s and 1s. Too easy? See how high you can go! Option: See how many steps you can count yourself taking in the snow.</p>	<p>Fill one cup with snow and bring it inside. Fill another cup with ice. Which do you think will melt first?</p>
<p>Have a family member read a story to you. Find a new story, or maybe re-read your favorite!</p>	<p>Grab some paper and tape. Practice stretching out big words by finding and labeling 7 things around your house.</p>	<p>Write numbers 1-20 and make sure they are all correctly formed. Too easy? See how much higher you can write.</p>	<p>What can you build in the snow? A snowman? A puppy dog? A castle? If you create something, have a parent send me a picture!</p>
<p>Find a big book and search for at least 10 words that you know in the book.</p>	<p>Copy a sentence from the a book you have read. Practice reading the sentence and make a picture to match it.</p>	<p>Go on a shape hunt! How many flat (2D) shapes can you find? How many solid (3D) shapes? Option: Now go make some shapes in the snow!</p>	<p>Ask a family member what you could do to be helpful for them. Be others- focused and do your best to help them out! When we come back to school, tell me how you helped.</p>
<p>Find a magazine, newspaper, or old piece of mail and circle all of the words you recognize. Can you read any of the sentences?</p>	<p>Go outside and write your name in the snow! See if you can write all the names of the people in your family.</p>	<p>Make 8 <, >, or = to equations. Solve them and have a family member check them. Talk about how you used math to cook.</p>	<p>Look out your window. What do you see? Use paints, or other colors to paint a picture.</p>
